

CODE OF CONDUCT OF THE INSTITUTO SUPERIOR DE AGRONOMIA (TECHNIAL UNIVERSITY OF LISBON)

Through its code of conduct, done in agreement with the Law 62/2007, the ISA aims to ensure that its members are guided by an ethical code based on the core values of integrity, honesty and loyalty.

By accepting the general code of conduct of the ISA (the ISA-GCC), the student makes a commitment to act in accordance with the values listed here, which encourage learning, and to respect the following principles of conduct, which form a particularly important aspect of university life:

- a) equality of opportunity;
- b) academic responsibility;
- c) scientific ethics.

For its part, the ISA is committed to creating the physical conditions and the academic environment within which each student can adhere to the words and spirit of this code of conduct.

Regardless of the nature of the studies or training programme, **the undersigned agrees specifically to:**

- a) not provide or receive help from others in any work, test, examination or other activity where this is not expressly permitted;
- b) carry out all tasks and activities in an honest manner, respecting the regulations established, copyright, and indicating, when requested, the sources from which the information was drawn;
- c) be punctual, not only by meeting the deadlines set for the various activities but also in attending classes and other academic meetings;
- d) use the available equipment properly, contributing to the good upkeep and preservation of the ISA's facilities;
- e) play an active role in promoting the spirit of the ISA-GCC.

Examples of unacceptable activities in the field of scientific fraud, which will be subject to appropriate penalties, include:

copying: intentional use of unauthorized sources of information or unauthorized collaboration with colleagues in tests or examinations;

plagiarizing: intentional use of the words or ideas of others as the original work of the student, with deliberate concealment of the true sources;

falsifying: intentional use of any type of false information, invented or distorted, which is presented as genuine information obtained through a procedure for scientific research;

encouraging dishonest conduct: to facilitate or assist other students to act in any way at variance to the letter or the spirit of the ISA-GCC.

Blatant transgression of the ISA-GCC will be dealt with according to the procedures prescribed by law (Article 75, Law 62/2007) and the statutes of the ISA and UTL.
